## **Mowing Regulations**

Section 91.24 of the City of Sutton Municipal code requires that the owner or occupant of any lot or piece of ground within the City shall keep the lot or piece of ground and the adjoining right-of-way free of any growth of 12" or more in height of weeds, grass, or vegetation. If you do not meet this regulation you will receive a letter from the City and have 5 days to comply. After this time period the City of Sutton will charge a minimum of \$100.00 to mow your property with an hourly charge of \$100.00 for the First Mowing, \$150.00 for Second Mowing, and \$200.00 for the Third Mowing.

Do not put your grass clippings, leaves, garden waste or tree limbs in your trash toter. If you need to dispose of grass clippings, leaves, garden waste or tree limbs, Please visit the compost pile at W. Hickory

Do not blow your grass in the streets when mowing.

NOTE: We have been having an issue with people dumping things in the compost dump that are not allowed. The City has a permit with the State and will lose that permit if the rules are not followed. If this happens it could mean extra costs for residents to have a way of dumping grass clippings and limbs. The only things allowed at the compost pile are: grass clippings, leaves, garden waste and tree limbs. NO OTHER WOOD ITEMS ARE ALLOWED. PLASTIC BAGS ARE NOT PERMITTED.

## **Board of Health**

The Board of Health (BOH) is responsible for enforcing state and local laws and ordinances regarding nuisances and sanitation of the City. The BOH members consist of: the Mayor, Council President, Police Chief, and a health professional. If the BOH recognizes a violation of nuisance ordinance, they will contact the property owner and begin discussions to identify and correct the violation. After a set amount of time the BOH will conduct a follow up review to ensure the violation is fixed. What is a nuisance? A nuisance is either knowingly or unknowingly allowing a condition to occur which creates a public interference, dangerous conditions or a Public Heath hazard. Some general offenses may include, but are not limited to, the following: used appliances or abandoned appliances, litter or waste material, filthy substances which may contaminate wells or springs, unsightly or abandoned buildings, animal manure, abandoned or nonworking vehicles. A copy of the full list of nuisances within the ordinances can be obtained at City Hall. The BOH reminds you that citywide cleanup is coming up May 6-14 and would be a great opportunity to get rid of things that might be a nuisance on your property. (See article on


Pool season is just around the corner. Weather permitting the pool will open May 20th. The hours will be as follows:

Non-permanent decorations are allowed: during a funeral, burial, Memorial Day and the Christmas season. Two weeks after Memorial Day and Christmas these decorations need to be removed as do flowers not in a permanent vase. Non-permanent decorations are not allowed throughout the year. Any flowers and non-permanent decorations WILL be removed two weeks after (Memorial Day & Christmas) by the city staff for cemetery maintenance reasons. As soon as flowers, wreaths, emblems or other items used at funerals or placed on graves become unsightly or faded, or if they are inappropriate or disrespectful, they will be removed and no responsibility for their protection or maintenance is assumed by the City. The determination of an item becoming 'unsightly' will be decided by the cemetery supervisor and/or cemetery board. The City reserves the right to remove any and all unsightly or inappropriate objects from cemetery lots. There will be no planting allowed on or around graves.

The following examples of items that are unsightly and/or inappropriate decorations include, but are not limited to:

Glass jars or bottles Tin or Aluminum cans Banners or banner hangers Flowers (faded, torn, tattered, broken) Plant decorations WITH REAL GRAIN attached Metal art (staked, non-staked, painted or non-painted) Wind Decorations (chimes, bells, spinners, etc.) Produce (seasonally decorated or natural) Bucket containers (plastic or metal) Sports equipment, clothing or flags Decorative letters (i.e. spelling out nicknames)
The following examples of items that are nonpermanent decorations include, but are not

Figurines
Plaques (with writing or pictures, with or without stands) Shepherd Hooks (plus any item hanging from them) Solar lights
